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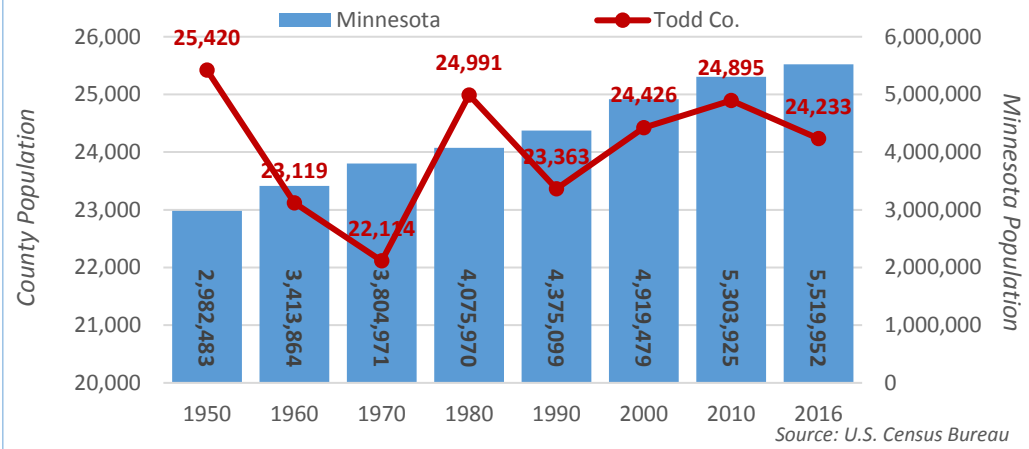

Figure 1. Population Change, 1950-2016

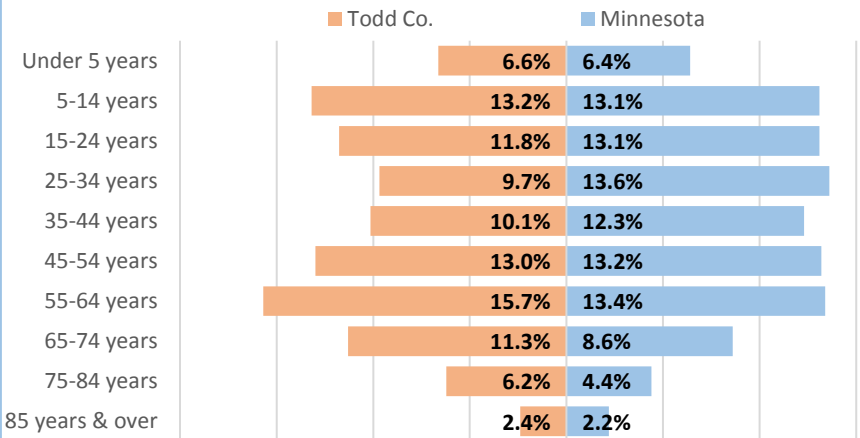

Figure 2. Percentage of Population by Age Group, 2016

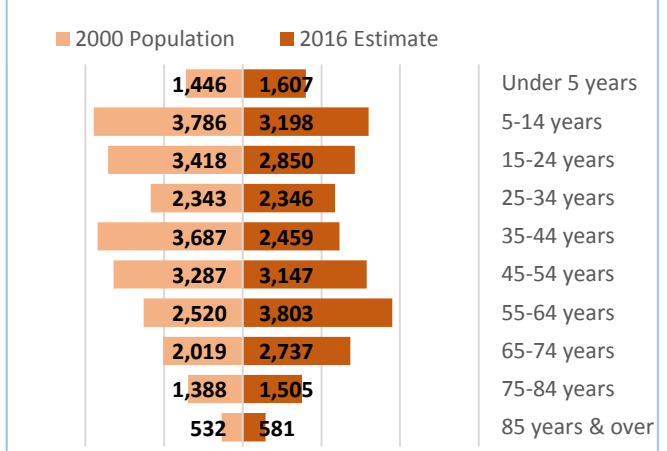

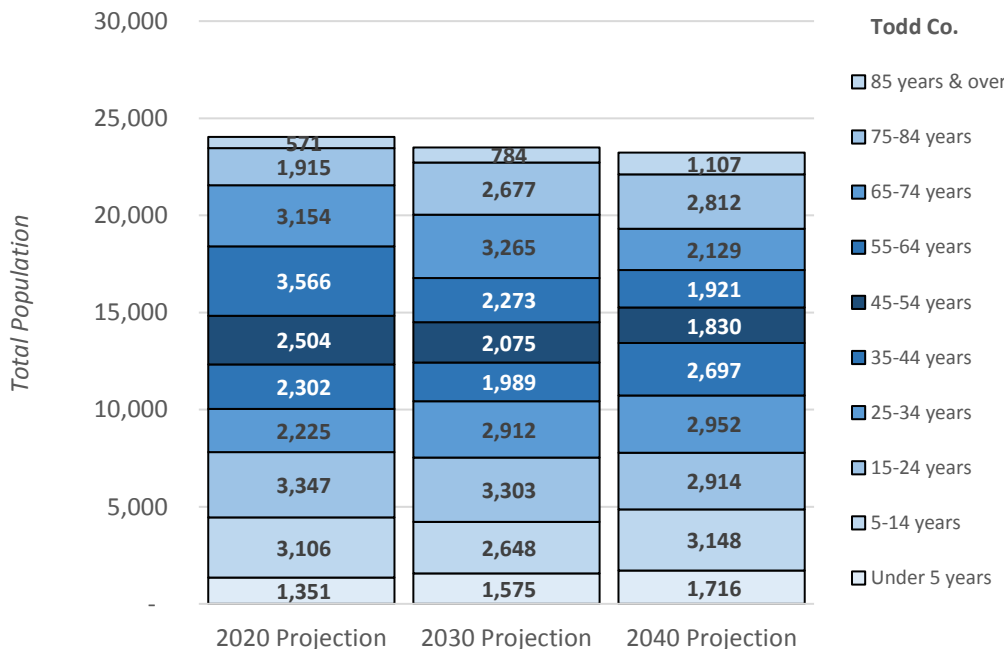

Figure 5. Annual Labor Force Estimates

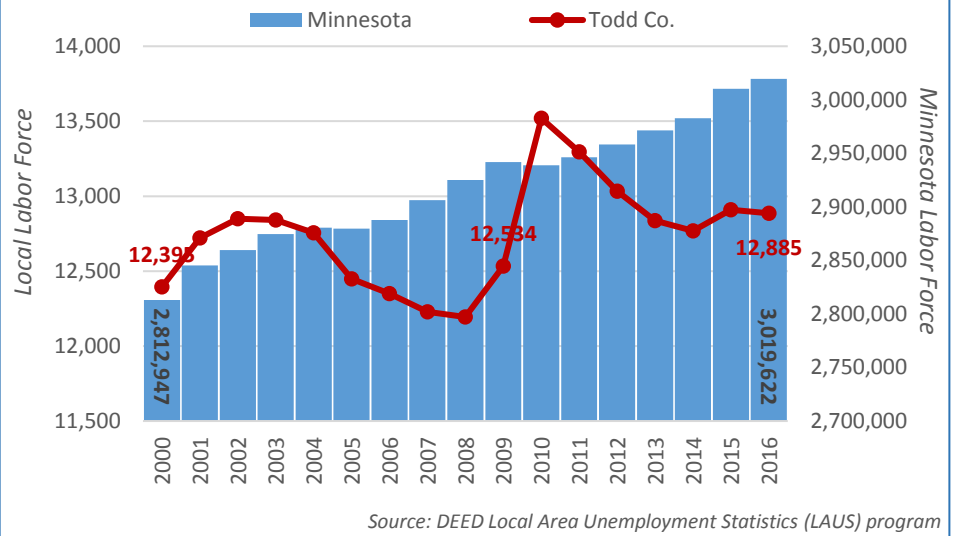


Figure 6. Unemployment Rates, 2000-2016

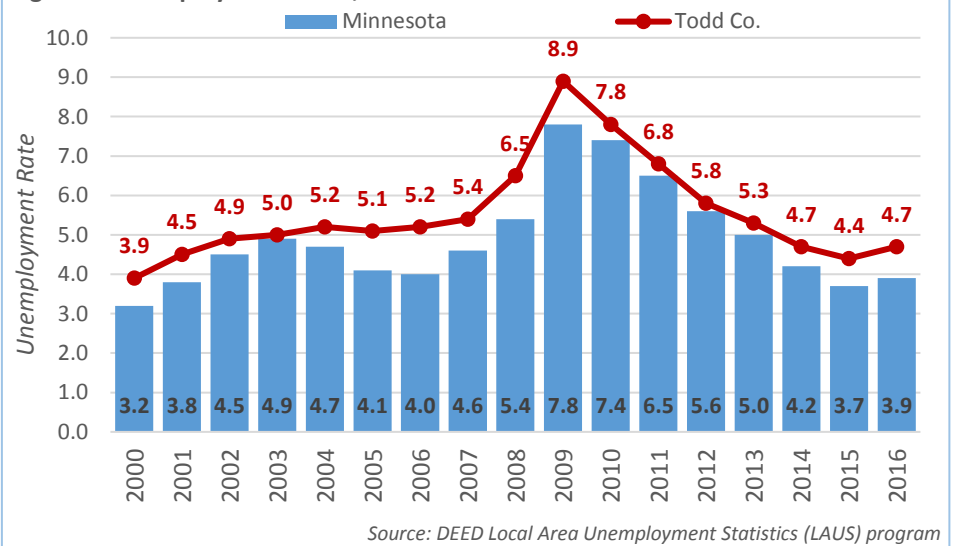


Figure 7. Jobseekers Per Vacancy, 2006-2016

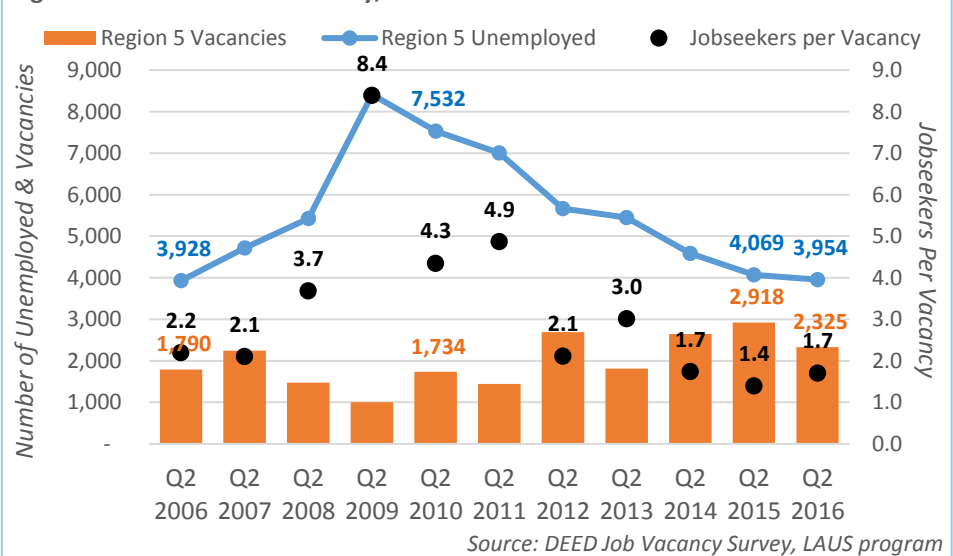

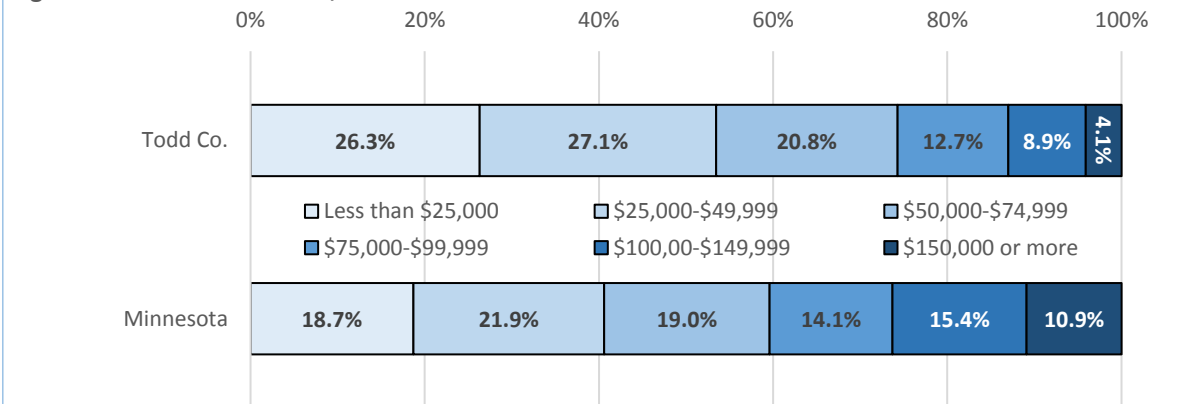

Figure 8. Household Incomes, 2015



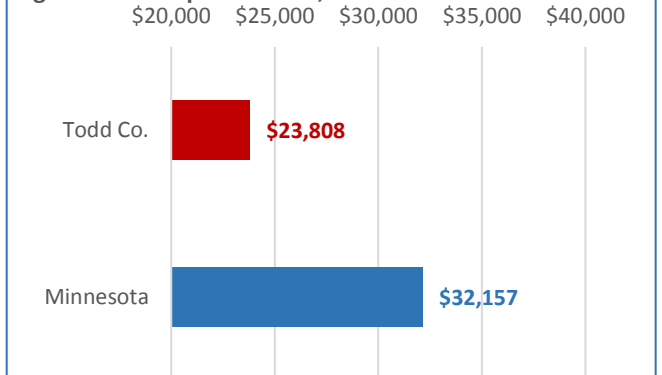

Figure 10. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 4 2016

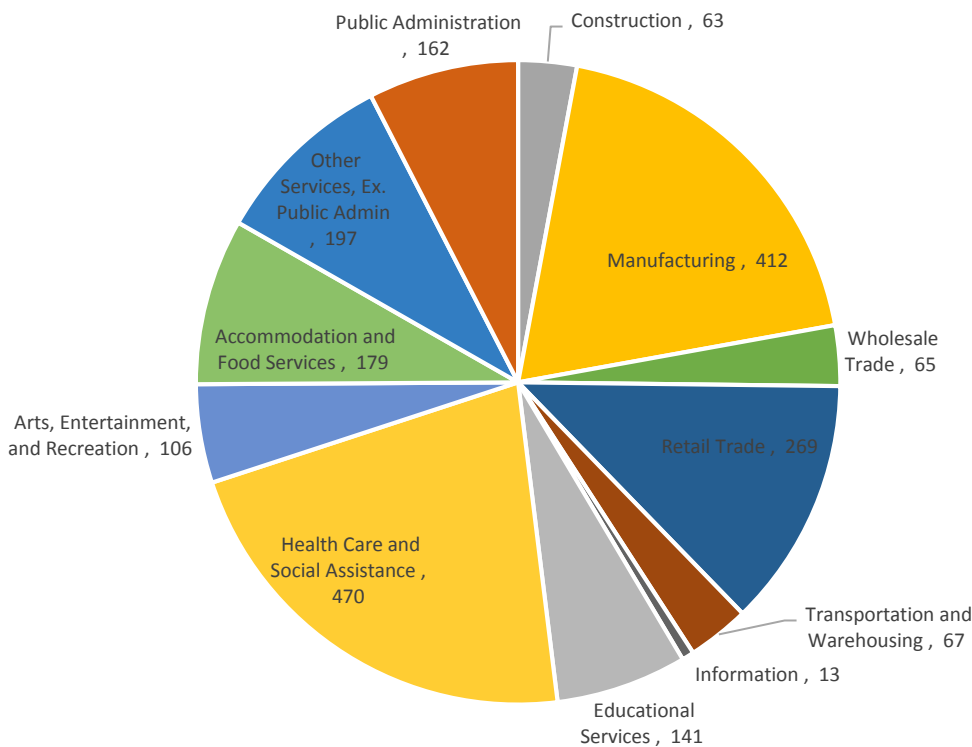
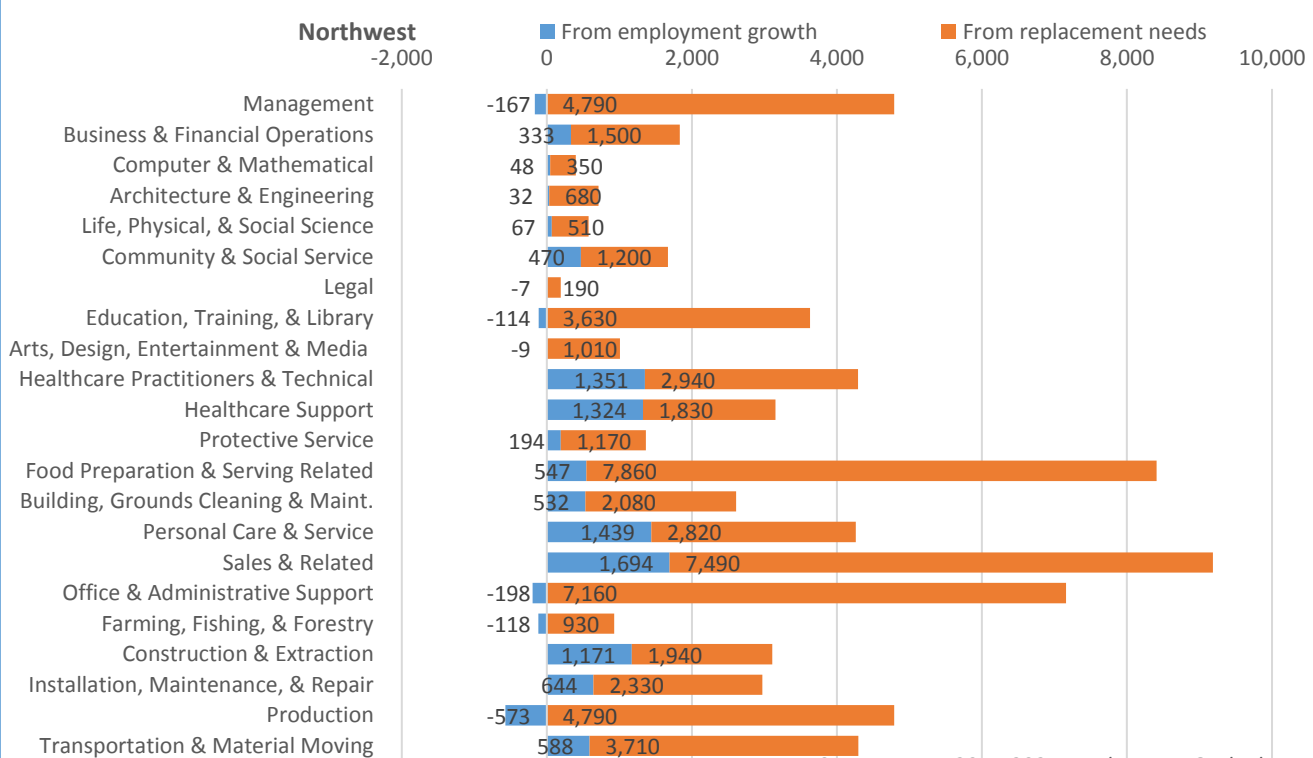

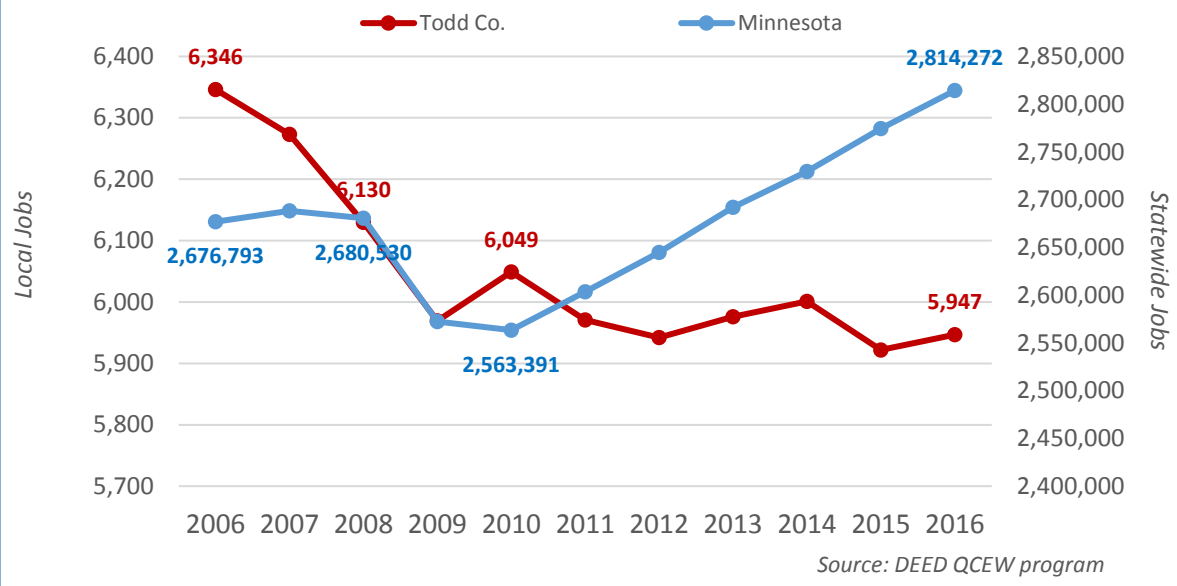
